

BYLAW 16 Public Health, Safety, Morale and amenity

To revise and consolidate regulations concerning public health, safety, morale and amenity.

1. By-law No. 7 and 13 and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed.
2. "Municipality" means the Municipality of the town of Barkmere
"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Barkmere
"Inspector of Sanitation and "Constable" means the persons appointed to said office by the Council
"Citizen" means any person, male or female, who may permanently or for the time being reside in the Municipality.
3. The burning of rubbish, refuse, brush and the like is permitted only when carried out in accordance with Provincial regulations. No outdoor fire shall be left unattended. All such fires shall be thoroughly extinguished.
4. No cigarette butt, cigar butt, pipe dottle, match or the like shall be thrown on the ground.
5. Ashes shall be stored in non-combustible containers only. No ashes shall be deposited on the ground until the lapse of twenty-four hours after their removal from a stove, fireplace, furnace or the like.
6. Highly inflammable or otherwise dangerous materials shall not be stored in inhabited buildings.
7. Riots, unseemly noises, obscene or profane language, disturbances and disorderly assemblages are prohibited within the municipality. Gaming, the playing of dice, cards and other games of chance with betting are also prohibited within the Municipality.
8. Bathing from any property on which there are buildings or other structures is prohibited to any but the owner or occupant thereof and their families and guests, except by express permission of the owner or occupant. Every bather in public view shall be decently garbed.
9. The firing of rifles, revolvers, shotguns or other firearms into or over the waters of Bark Lake during the months of April, May, June, July and August in any year is prohibited.
10. Logs, wood, branches, trash and other floating or semi-floating objects shall not be thrown or deposited in the waters of Bark Lake. Owners, occupants and others shall take every precaution that wharves, boathouses and other structures do not become demolished and float away, in whole or in part. It is the duty of every citizen to remove from the waters of Bark Lake all objects or refuse floating therein in the vicinity of his property or place of residence.
11. Advertising signs of every description are prohibited on all public or private property within the Municipality. This prohibition shall not apply to "For Sale" or "To Let" signs and the like, when not over four square feet in area and erected upon the property to which they refer, or to simple

signs of reasonable size announcing the trade or profession of the occupant of the premises to which they shall be attached. However, signs in the last of the above categories must be approved by Council.

12. Owners and occupants of property in the Municipality shall not allow their premises to become a nuisance to any person.
13. It is forbidden to allow any drainage or sewage to reach the waters of Bark Lake, clean surface water and roof water during storms alone excepted.
14. No person shall deposit garbage or refuse in the waters of Bark Lake, or scatter or deposit the same on his own property or on the property of another.
15. The owner of every dead animal, and the owner or occupant of the property on which such a carcass may be found, shall forthwith notify the Constable, who shall immediately remove the said carcass and make property disposal of it. The cost of such disposal shall be collected by the Constable from the owner of the carcass. Depositing the carcass of a dead animal in any of the water within the Municipality is forbidden.
16. No person shall construct a privy, cesspool, septic tank, dry well or other device for sewage disposal, until the size of the disposal field therefore and the location thereof shall have been approved by the Inspector of Sanitation, nor shall any person sink a well the water from which is intended for human use , or the water from any spring for this purpose, without approval by the Inspector of Sanitation
17. To carry out the provisions of this By-law there is created the office of Inspector of Sanitation. The Inspector of Sanitation shall be appointed by Council, which shall fix his remuneration, if any, and he shall hold office during its pleasure.
18. Any person violating or contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be subject to a fine with or without costs, but not to exceed Forty dollars (\$40.00). and in default of the immediate payment of such fine or fine and costs to an imprisonment not to exceed two calendar months, said imprisonment to cease, however, at any time before the term set by the court, upon the payment of the said fine or fines and costs. Any person who may violate or contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to the penalties mentioned for each and every day during which such violation or contravention shall last, each such day's violation or contravention being held a distinct and separate offence.
19. A majority vote of the Council shall be required to amend or to repeal this By-law
20. This By-law shall come into effect in the manner indicated in the charter of the town of Barkmere and in the Cities & Towns Act.

To revise and consolidate regulations concerning buildings.

- 1. "Municipality" means the Municipality of the Town of Barkmere.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Barkmere.

"Building Inspector" means the person appointed to this office by Council.

"Structures" shall, without limiting the generality of the term, include boathouses, boat sheds, boat shelters, wharves, docks, slips, floating docks, rafts, hangars, sheds, outhouses and privies.

- 2. ~~The erection of any building or structure for any use other than for use as a single family dwelling or for the housing of boats and the operation of any club, camping ground, public summer camp or other like enterprise within the Municipality is forbidden, except by express resolution of Council, and then only under such conditions as Council may stipulate.~~

- 3. ~~No building or other structure within the Municipality shall be erected within one hundred feet of the building of any adjoining owner, or be located in such a way as to preclude an adjoining owner from building on his property under the provisions of this paragraph, save by mutual consent of the property owners concerned and/or with the express approval of Council.~~

~~Except by express resolution of Council no building intended for residential purposes shall be erected on any original cadastral lot fronting on Bark Lake or any sub-division or part thereof unless the frontage on Bark Lake for each building on said lot or sub-division or part thereof is at least two hundred feet.~~

- 4. All persons desiring to erect, enlarge or alter a building or other structure within the Municipality shall file with the Building Inspector an application for a building permit upon the specification form provided. Each such application shall be accompanied by two sets of drawings to scale of the proposed work comprising plans of each floor, a front elevation and a side elevation, and by the fee required for such permit. If the building permit be granted one set of these drawings shall be returned, properly endorsed, to the applicant, and shall constitute the official plans of the structure.

5. No building or other structure shall be erected, enlarged or altered unless and until the applicant shall have submitted to the Building Inspector, in addition to the drawings and specifications required under paragraph 4 hereof, a plot plan showing the relation of the proposed building or structure to the boundaries of his property and to any existing buildings on adjoining properties. The Building Inspector may cause the location of such building or other structure to be altered if he shall think fit.
6. No person shall erect, enlarge or alter any building or other structure within the Municipality without first obtaining the proper permit therefor from the Building Inspector.
7. No building or other structure shall be moved from one site to another within the Municipality, or from a site without the Municipality to one within it, unless a permit for such moving shall have been obtained from the Building Inspector.
8. The erection of any building or other structure for which a permit has been issued shall be effectively commenced within six months delay from the date of the permit, failing which the permit shall lapse. Any building or other structure for which a permit has been issued shall have the exterior completed in accordance with the specification form submitted within eighteen months of the date of the permit unless an extension shall previously have been obtained from the Building Inspector. No permit shall be transferred save by express consent of Council.
9. The Building Inspector may at any time order the suspension of work on any building or other structure, if the same does not comply with these regulations, or if it shall depart from the official plans. He may also, after authorization by Council, require the demolition of any such building or other structure.
10. Every chimney, flue or the like shall be provided with a spark arrester over its outlet. The opening in such spark arrester shall not measure more than one-quarter inch in their greatest dimensions. No black iron or japanned stove-pipe shall be used as a chimney.
11. No stove or other heater shall be set closer than six inches to any combustible surface, and the said surface shall be protected by a ventilated metal guard or otherwise. No stovepipe or other metal flue shall be used after it shall have holes in it.
12. Every building or boathouse in the Municipality so located as to be exposed to public view shall be properly finished and maintained by painting with non-metallic paint, staining or otherwise to ensure that it shall present a neat appearance at all times.

13. The Building Inspector may order the repair, alteration or total demolition of any building or other structure, which he may deem dangerous to life or to health or totally unfitted for the purpose for which it is intended or used.

14. At the request of Council, the Building Inspector shall visit and examine any building or other structure, for the purpose of ensuring that its construction conforms to these regulations.

15. To carry out the provisions of this By-law there is created the office of Building Inspector. The Building Inspector shall be appointed by Council, which shall fix his remuneration, if any, and he shall hold office during its pleasure.

16. An appeal from the decisions of the Building Inspector may be made to Council, but pending the decision by Council on any such appeal, any decision of the Building Inspector shall be binding.

17. Any person violating or contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be subject to a fine, with or without costs, but not to exceed Forty Dollars, and in default of the immediate payment of such fine or fine and costs, to an imprisonment not to exceed two calendar months, said imprisonment to cease, however, at any time before the term set by the court, upon the payment of the said fine or fine and costs. Any person who may violate or contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to the penalties mentioned for each and every day during which such violation or contravention being held a distinct and separate offence.

18. A majority vote of the Council shall be required to amend or to repeal this By-law.

19. This By-law shall come into effect in the manner indicated in the charter of the Town of Barkmere and in the Cities & Towns Act.

2. The erection or operation of any hotel, boardinghouse, rooming-house, club, camping ground, public summer camp of any kind, or any other like enterprise within the municipal limits is forbidden.

3. No residence shall be erected on any original cadastral lot which fronts on Bark Lake nor on any part of such lot, unless such residence is at least one hundred feet from any other residence, nor shall it be located in such a way as to preclude an adjoining owner from building on his property under the provisions of this paragraph.

No residence shall be erected on any original cadastral lot which fronts on Bark Lake nor on any part of such lot, unless the frontage on Bark Lake for each residence on said lot or part thereof is at least two hundred feet.

BYLAW 18 Boats and the Operation thereof

To revise and consolidate regulations concerning boats and the operation thereof.

1. By-law No. 12 and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed.
2. "Municipality" means the Municipality of the town of Barkmere
"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Barkmere
"Navigation Inspector" means the person appointed to this office by the Council
"Motor boat" means any vessel propelled by machinery.
"Boat for hire" means a boat rented without the service of an operator, upon any basis of payment whatever
"Water taxi" means a boat hired with the service of a competent operator who is a resident of the Municipality.
3. No motor boat, boat for hire or water taxi, shall be operated within the Municipality unless the owner shall have secured the necessary license for the motor from the Municipality.
4. No motor boat, boat for hire or water taxi shall be operated without a proper muffler on the exhaust thereof.
5. The operator of any water taxi may refuse to transport any person who may be insane, intoxicated, under the influence of drugs, or otherwise unable to care for himself or herself.
6. In the interests of safety, all persons shall obey the orders and instructions of the operator of the boat in which they are passengers.
7. The maximum fares which may be charged by operators of water taxis shall comply with the attached schedule. For any trip where two or more passengers are destined to different zones, as defined in the attached Schedule, the total maximum fares payable by all such passenger together shall be the fare scheduled for that zone where the last one of said passengers is delivered.
8. The maximum fares fixed by this By-law shall apply only to trips commenced between the hours of six o' clock in the morning and ten o' clock in the evening of the same day. For trips commenced at other times, the maximum rates set forth may be increased by fifty per cent (50%).
9. No buoy or other navigational aid shall be placed or installed by any person without the prior approval of the Navigation Inspector. This provision shall not apply to any buoy or other navigational aid placed or installed on the instructions of Council.
10. All boats and boats for hire and all water taxis should conform to and comply with the FEDERAL SMALL vessels regulations 1958 and any amendments thereto.

11. To carry out the provisions of this By-law, there is created the office of Navigation Inspector. The Navigation Inspector shall be appointed by Council which shall fix his remuneration, if any, and he shall hold office during Council's pleasure.
12. A majority vote of the Council shall be required to amend or to repeal this By-law
13. Any person violating or contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be subject to a fine with or without costs, but not to exceed Forty dollars (\$40.00). and in default of the immediate payment of such fine or fine and costs to an imprisonment not to exceed two calendar months, said imprisonment to cease, however, at any time before the term set by the court, upon the payment of the said fine or fines and costs. Any person who may violate or contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to the penalties mentioned for each and every day during which such violation or contravention shall last, each such day's violation or contravention being held a distinct and separate offence.
14. This By-law shall come into effect in the manner indicated in the charter of the town of Barkmere and in the Cities & Towns Act.

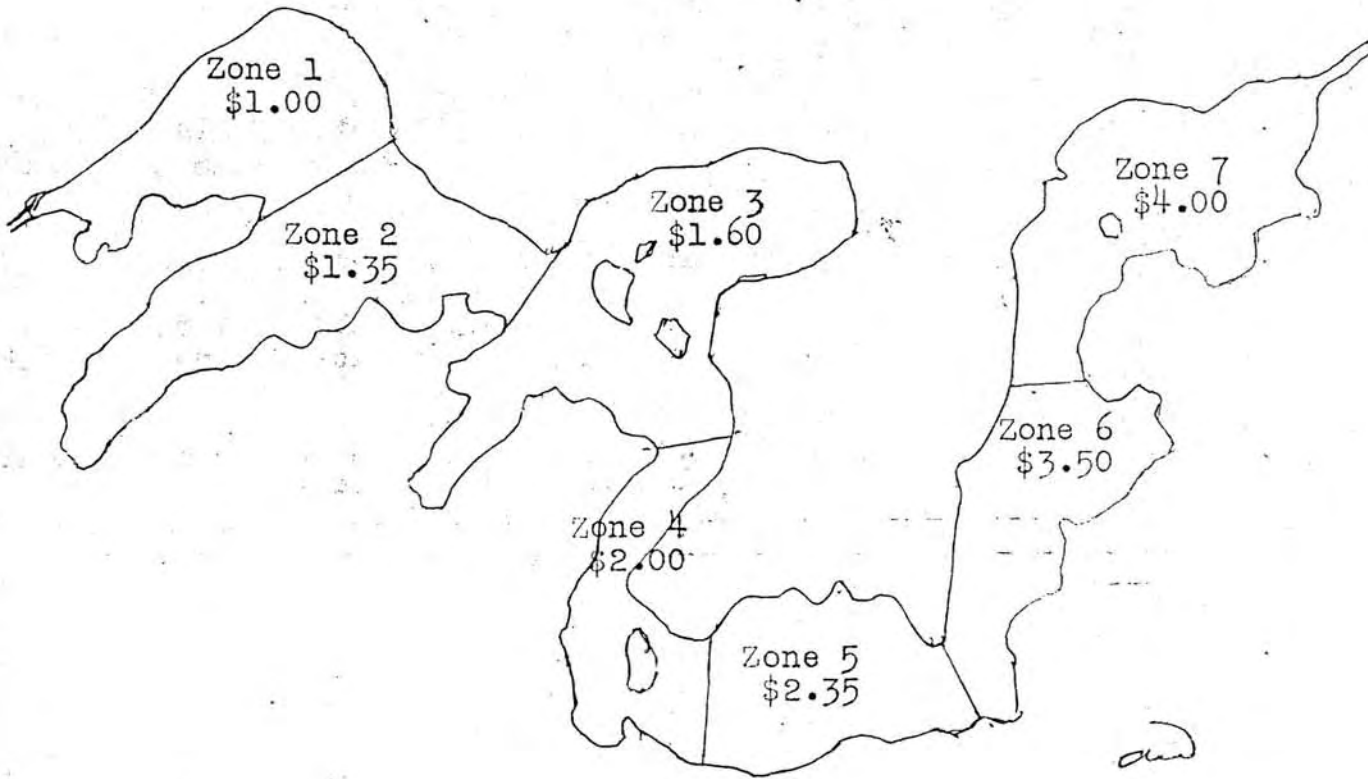

BYLAW 19 Roads, streets, public highways and parks

To revise and consolidate regulations concerning roads, streets, public highways and parks.

1. By-law No. 14 and 15 and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed.
2. "Municipality" means the Municipality of the town of Barkmere
"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Barkmere
"Street, road, lane, alley or path" means a parcel of land specifically set aside for pedestrian or vehicular passage, but shall not include cattle paths
"Public grounds and public places" means all lands owned by the Municipality and in addition, all commons or areas where the Municipality has the duty of maintaining order.
"Park" means any area within the Municipality designated as a park either by this By-law or by any resolution of the Council
"Roads Inspector" means the person appointed to this office by Council.
"Parks Inspector" means the person appointed to this office by Council.
3. The Council, either at a regular meeting or at a special meeting called for the purpose, shall have authority to pass a resolution ordering that all public roads and highways, or specified road or sections of roads only, in the Municipality shall be closed against such traffic as shall be specified in the said resolution and for such a length of time or for such periods of time as the said resolution shall mention..
4. No new streets or roads shall be laid out or opened in the Municipality without the prior consent of the Council given by a resolution passed by the said Council.
5. No person may encroach in, upon or over a Municipally owned street, road, alley, land, bridge, culvert, public ground, public place, pavement sidewalk, crossing or streams and waters, and no person shall damage or injure the same or make improper use thereof, either by piling material thereon, digging ditches, trenches or holes therein or performing excavations so close thereto as to endanger the same or persons or vehicles making use thereof, without written permission of the roads Inspector
6. No person shall make excavations for water pipes, conduits or wiring of any kind in, upon or across any Municipally owned street, road, lane, public ground, pavement sidewalk, crossing or streams and waters without first receiving a permit from the roads, Inspector and making such deposit as the Roads Inspector shall demand to guarantee the satisfactory completion of the permitted undertaking.
7. No person shall hang wires, conduits, chains, ropes, flags or banners across any Municipally owned street or road without first receiving the written permission of the roads Inspector.
8. No person shall erect any sign, signpost, awning, pole rack or obstruction or any sort on or over Municipal property without the written permission of the Roads Inspector.

9. No person shall park any vehicle or boat in any area designated by the Council as a zone where parking is prohibited and so indicated by publicly displayed signs or posters.
10. The entire area of Goulden Island is hereby designated as a park.
11. No person shall enter a park except between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening local time prevailing in the Municipality. The Council may from time to time by resolution change the hours during which persons may enter a park.
12. No person shall remain in any park after eight o'clock in the evening, local time prevailing in the Municipality, without having first obtained the consent of the Parks Inspector.
13. No one shall indulge in any game or athletic contest in a park except at places and at times designated by the Parks Inspector
14. It is prohibited for any person visiting or frequenting a park
 - a) To do any shooting or hunting;
 - b) To throw or project stones or any other objects by hand or with any instrument by any means whatsoever;
 - c) To sell or offer for sale anything;
 - d) To damage any fence, dock, wharf, building, shelter, structure, bench, lawn, tree, shrub, flowers, land, grass or any other property of the Municipality.
15. No rubbish, refuse, papers, boxes, cartons, garbage, or trash shall be left on the ground in any park or thrown into Bark Lake. All rubbish, refuse, papers, boxes, cartons, garbage and trash together with all cigar butts, cigarette butts, pipe dottles and matches shall be deposited only in the receptacles provided for such purpose under the instructions of the parks Inspector.
16. Save as otherwise indicated by appropriate signs, no person shall enter or in any way use any buildings on Goulden Island without having first obtained the consent of the parks Inspector.
17. The Council may from time to time by resolution make regulations concerning the use of parks.
18. To carry out the provisions of this By-law, there are created the offices of Roads Inspector and parks Inspector. The Roads Inspector and the parks Inspector shall be appointed by Council which shall fix their respective remunerations, if any, and each shall hold office during Council's pleasure.
19. Any person violating or contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be subject to a fine with or without costs, but not to exceed Forty dollars and in default of the immediate payment of such fine or fine and costs to an imprisonment not to exceed two calendar months, said imprisonment to cease, however, at any time before the term set by the court, upon the payment of the said fine or fines and costs. Any person who may violate or contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to the penalties mentioned for each and every day during which such violation or contravention shall last, each such day's violation or contravention being held a distinct and separate offence.
20. A majority vote of the Council shall be required to amend or to repeal this By-law.

21. This By-law shall come into effect in the manner indicated in the charter of the town of Barkmere and in the Cities & Towns Act.
